



Exodus 4

The children of Israel lived in Egypt and had to work very, very hard, for they were slaves. A slave is a person who is owned by a master who makes them work long hours, with not much food and no money. The master might whip the slaves and no one cared. It was a very sad thing to be a slave. God watched over his people, the Israelites, and God was going to help them. One day God spoke to Moses out of a burning bush. Do you remember that story? God told Moses to go and help his people, who were called the children of Israel.

Do you think Moses wanted to go to Egypt and speak to the mighty king of Egypt? This king was called a Pharaoh and he was very mean and stubborn. Moses told God he really didn't want to go, but God said he would send Moses' brother Aaron to help and God would be with them. Moses said, "What if the Israelites won't listen to me? How will they know you sent me?" God asked Moses, "What is that in your hand?"

The staff turned into a long, slithery snake! Moses jumped back and God said, "Now take ahold of the snake's tail and pick it up."

Oh Oh! What do you think would happen if you take ahold of a snake's tail? It can turn around and bite you, can't it? Moses was afraid, but still he obeyed God. Moses trusted that God wouldn't let the snake hurt him. He was shaking when he reached down and grasped the snake by the tail. What happened? Did the snake bite him? No, God was showing Moses how powerful he was and that Moses could trust him, because God wouldn't hurt him. When Moses took the snake by the tail, the snake turned back into a rod again! Wow! God can do magical things, can't he?

God said, if the Israelites don't believe you, show them this sign. Throw your rod down in front of them and it will turn into a snake.

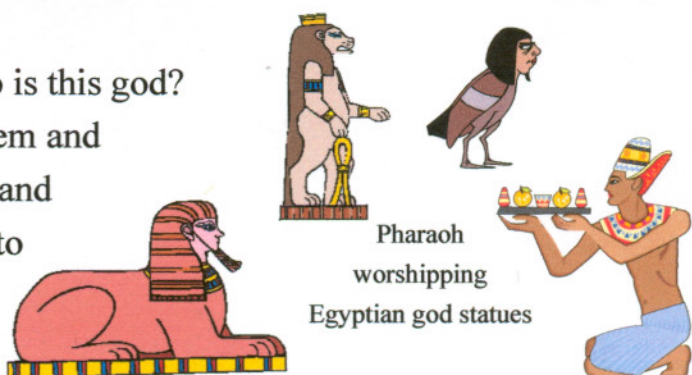

Now Moses and Aaron were ready to go to the palace to see the mighty Pharaoh. In our next lesson we'll see what some of these signs are.

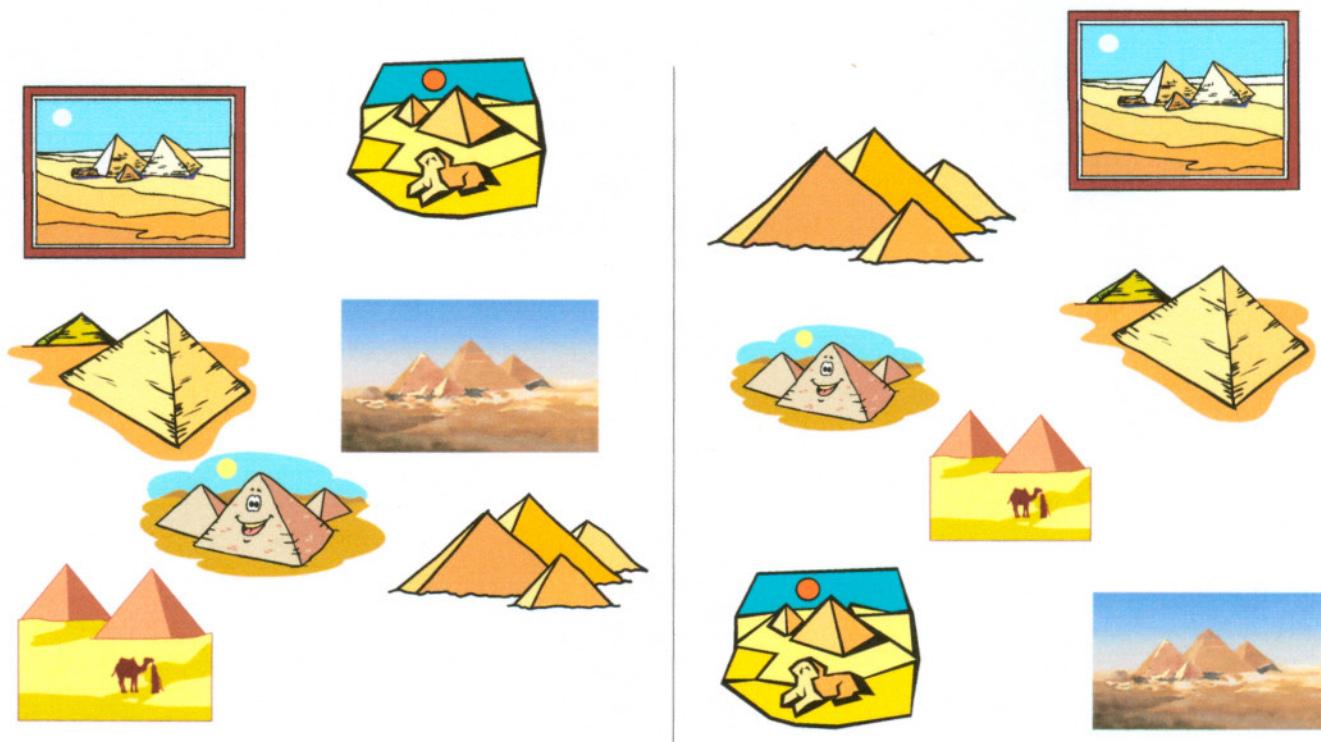

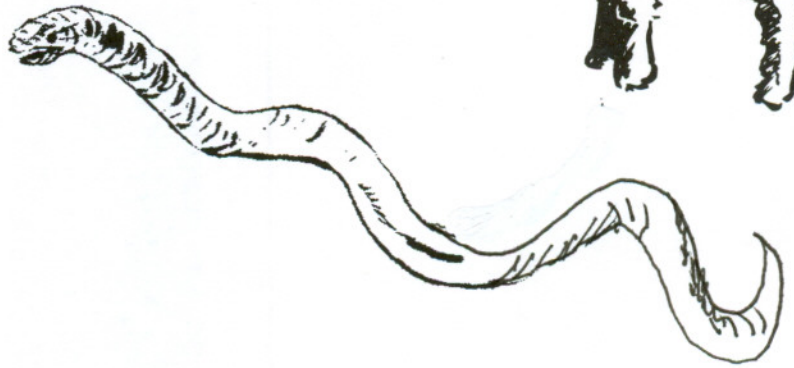
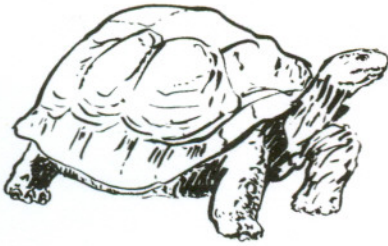
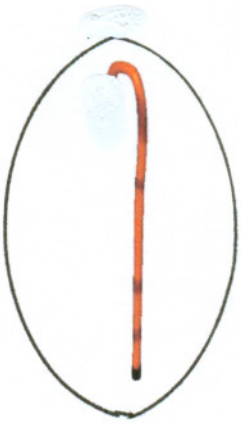


Pharaoh was very mean to the poor Israelite slaves. Can you draw a mean face on Pharaoh and sad faces on the slaves, then color the picture?
